Presidents Report - Scott Rentsch

I would like to extend a warm welcome to everyone joining us here today at Penshurst for round 10 that sees us play Tatyoon, with some great games to watch in both the football and netball. Today will also be a memorable one with the first ever, "Celebration of First Nations Culture." I would also like to acknowledge all First Peoples here today and the mobs and bloodlines that they represent, along with Paul Kelly who will officiate the Welcome to Country.

Our Senior footballers will wear specially designed jumpers that represent the indigenous men that take to the field for Penshurst and it also incorporates their extended families and bloodlines. This is shown through their family totems which are spread out across the front of the jumpers. The designs on the jumper resemble the coming together in a safe space and acceptance of all cultures on land of the Eastern Maar and Gundjitmara people with the Club. The front of the jumper was designed by two participants from the Wadamba Prison to Work Program. The back of the jumper was designed by our young local budding artist, Jackson Ellis. We are very proud to enveil this remarkable, limited edition jumper, that will be made available to players, supporters and the wider community to purchase. The senior netballers will also join in celebrating First Nations wearing their own specially designed bibs for the day.

We are proud to have past AFL players, Nathan Lovett Murray and Chris Egan play for the Bombers today, as part of the celebrations, so please make them feel welcome and catch up with them after the game.

The day is sponsored by Wanyaari Aboriginal Consultancy and Wathaurong Aboriginal Co Operative. Eastern Maar will deliver a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony at 11:45 am prior to the Reserves Match. Reserves players will be presented with their jumpers at 11:25 am and Jackson Ellis and Andrew (Chopsy) Vella will explain the designs on the jumpers. At 11:40 am all football and netball players, including Tatyoon players, are asked to congregate on the oval for the commencement of the Ceremony. Senior footballers will be presented with their jumpers at 12:45 pm with a start to the Senior game at 2:10 pm.

After the games have finished, presentations will be held in the Clubrooms at approximately 5:30 pm with an auction to follow after the evening meal. Some of the items up for auction include a signed Richmond Dreamtime jumper designed by Marlion Pickett and his partner Jess, worn in round 17 v Gold Coast 2022 in his 50th game, also a 2023 Geelong guernsey with a Certificate of Authenticity and a signed Essendon number 30 guernsey worn by Patrick "Paddy" Ryder in round 7, 2009 v Hawthorn.

I would like to give special mention to Chopsy for floating the idea and getting it up and going. Both himself and our Football Director, Trevor Mibus have put in countless hours towards making this special day happen and have been instrumental in getting the whole concept together.

Enjoy your day and I look forward to seeing you all in the Clubrooms after today's games.

FRONT:

"A celebration of First Nations Culture"

This football jumper has been designed for the Penshurst Football & Netball Club, and represents the indigenous men that take to the field for Penshurst and it also incorporates their extended Families and Bloodlines, this is shown through their Family totems which are spread out across the front of the Guernsey.

The Symbol below the collar on the top Centre part of the Jumper represents Family, since 1874 Penshurst Football & Netball club has been a safe, family friendly club.

Underneath the "Family" symbol you have Bunjil the creator, looking over the club and keeping us safe. Bunjil is also the Totem for the Barkindji People meaning "River People", this Totem has been added to the jumper to also represent Jake Bates-Gilby and his peoples.



Moving to the left of the Guernsey we have the Yellow tailed Cockatoo, the Totem of the "Lovett" peoples of the Gunditjmara Nation, this totem represents, Bunjil Lovett, Naichese Lovett, Ulzana Lovett, Montanna Lovett, Robbie Ellis, Tyler, Jackson, Hayden and Jett Ellis.

Now moving to the right of the Guernsey we have the Flying Fox, this is from East Central Queensland and is the totem of the Gooreng-Gooreng peoples, this Totem represents Andrew Vella and his family from Queensland.

In the middle of the Guernsey, we have a meeting place that represents the Football club and its Premiership years, the footprints coming across the Guernsey represent the coming together of people from all different walks of life to the one safe space, the Penshurst Football & Netball Club. The Blue and white dot work running through the Guernsey to the meeting place and then from the meeting place up to the other side of the guernsey represent the waterways in the local area that breed new life and a healthy supply of food for local mobs, especially eels.

Moving to the bottom of the Jumper we have the silhouette of Mt Rouse, this was brought into the jumper design to represent the Traditional Owners of Penshurst the Easten Maar peoples.

BACK:

The top of the jumper was designed so it formed a circle around the player's number. The symbols represents Elders, Grandparents, Dads, Mums, Brothers, Sisters & friends. We all come together each weekend as one big circle of friends & families to watch the football & netball.

The middle of the jumper represents the flowing of the Penshurst Wetlands. This is a local gathering for many kids around the town to meet up. They spend many hours fishing & swimming here.

The bottom of the jumper is the Sun rising every morning, 'Today is a new day & a new journey'.

PFNC INDIGENOUS DAY 'KOLORER MEDAL'

The Indigenous Day Kolorer Medal will be awarded to the Penshurst player who adheres by the Code of Conduct; courage, respectful (to umpires, teammates, and opposition), integrity, teamwork, fairness and plays well. This medal is for all senior grades of football and netball.

SENIOR FOOTBALL MID SEASON REPORT

Our start to the season sees the boys with 5 wins and 4 losses, placing us just outside the top 5 in 6th position. Not to worry though – we added Aaron Glare's services back to the playing group after a stint at Hamilton, alongside Edwin Rentsch, Alex Clemmens, Dylan Mannix. The very exciting change in our playing group though has been having 8 Senior debutants in round one against Great Western, including our youngsters, Edwin Rentsch, Jock Nicholls, George Huf, George Pern, Archie Bennett, Archie Page, Cooper Rentsch who played one game last year, and our not so youthful Dylan Mannix. Unfortunately, we couldn't secure the win in round one but were well in touch at the 3rd quarter break against a muchly Improved Great Western side.

Round 2 had us away against the Glen Dunkeld Rams, where we saw Alex Clemmens play his first Senior game for the Club. It was a tightly contested game, where a few more opportunities taken may have seen a 2-goal loss converted into a win.

Round 3 we travelled to play Lismore Derrinallum who have been notoriously hard to beat at home, and as expected with so many new and young faces it was going to take time to gel. This game saw us play some good team footy and get some structures right. Tom Prattley made his Senior debut for us this day and we recorded our first win of the season by 3 goals.

Round 4 was back home up against the reigning premiers being Ararat Eagles. You could see the boys harvested how good the winning feeling was from the week before and started hunting what was probably seen as a stronger side to most. We had 21 focused contributors and got another good win on the board that day by 5 goals, and this instilled on a young group belief that there best footy is good enough.

Round 5 was a glorious day for football at the Connor Wilson Reserve up against SMW Rovers. It was a special day with our great Clubman, Footballer, and person for many years – Tim McGregor playing his milestone 300th. On the other end of the spectrum, we had another debutant in Oscar Hausler. The game saw us get off to a blistering start playing our brand very well, until several quick injuries forced some structural changes to occur, and the game become a lot more of an arm wrestle. To the boys credited they fought the game out well an got the job done for our Debutant and Milestone Man, with the later having a standout game kicking 6 goals and gathering a BOG performance.

Round 6 we played Wickliffe Lake Bolac who appeared much improved going by their previous score lines. Against Hawkesdale-McArthur the boys knew the importance of this game in context to the rest of our season. We had a great battle and put up a very strong peformance, coming away with a very solid win banking another very valuable 4 points.

Overall, the group has grown in many aspects from the start of the year and is learning how to play some winning team-oriented Football. Individuals in the side are starting to learn their roles and positive positioning. We will keep striving to our goal of a finals berth but most importantly we want to have continual improvement as a side all year. Obviously, there will be hiccups and a few inconsistencies with the makeup of a younger group, but they are an absolute pleasure to coach. We are looking forward to how our group can improve and drive each other in the second half of the season.
